We've had another successful year in the Supporters Club (The Surf Club). In my 4th year as Supporters Club President, I would say this has seen the most significant transformation of our business both in the number of functions, the quality of services and the improvements to our Clubhouse. I want to thank the ongoing support of the Supporters Club Committee being Jenny Heery, Kerri Wells, Peter Keen, Natelee Keen and newly appointed Anita Penny for their commitment to the success of the Supporters Club. I'd also like to take the opportunity to thank Shawn Andersen our Event Manager, who, over the past 12 months has co-ordinated and initiated some of the changes.

In the past twelve months at The Surf Club, the business has improved in several areas. The committee, together with Event Manager Shawn Andersen has worked on ensuring a quicker response time from any enquiry and better conversions to sales. This has resulted in more booked functions. We have improved our online presence within the marketplace as well as worked on improving the appearance of all our marketing material, online branding, direct email, function brochures and our venue appearance, which has and will continue to result in more functions and more enquiries.

Functions are the primary source of income, with 73 secured in 9 months from April to December 2019. Each pays a venue hire fee and must utilise a minimum spend bar tab excluding day functions/meeting, etc. Weddings have improved from 17 bookings in 2018 (*9 months from Apr to Dec*) to 29 bookings in 2019 which is an increase of 70%, and there are already 14 wedding bookings for 2020.

As a committee together with Shawn, we worked hard to create events at The Surf Club as another source of revenue in the past 12 months. Over this time we've successfully hosted the Annual High Tea,

a Mercedes Benz Octoberfest, Sportsman Lunch with Greg Ritchie and our inaugural Ladies Lunch with Libby Trickett, all of which were sold out in days. We continued our NYE celebration event, which again was a sell out to over 150 guests partying with drinks, food and live music.

Probably the most exciting news over the past 12 months has been the agreement structured with Michael and Brooke Moffat from TIDE Catering. This has always been a key driver of mine and the committee to successfully operate a breakfast option from The Surf Club. Despite a couple of false starts, I'm confident that our relationship with TIDE will be a long and lasting one. They now operate breakfast every Saturday & Sunday from 6/7am till midday and then on Sunday we stay open later offering an all-day lunch till 6 pm accompanied by live music. We will continue to extend this offering with our next focus being Friday morning breakfast.

Finally, The Surf Club venue has undergone internal refurbishments with new floor tiles, tiled bar front, and new bar top. The new back bar framing & shelving has created a more inviting back wall to display product and improve the appearance of the room. The Supporters Club has invested heavily in making our Clubhouse continue to maintain its presence in arguably the best location in town.

In Summary, thank you all who have supported the initiatives of the Supporters Club. The club is benefiting from our success through increased rent to now be the most significant contributor to the club. Once again, thanks to the committee and Shawn, we look forward to continued success in 2019.

I am pleased to present the financial reports for the club for the 2018 – 2019 season. Overall the club remains in a consistently acceptable position with the retained profits at the end of the year being \$1,359,804 as at April 30, 2019 and continues to be debt free.

Please find following a brief overview of the financial reports:

Income

Income for the season was \$388,461 which is up from the previous season due to an increase in fundraising, membership fees and clothing sales.

This season the club has focused the financial efforts in:

- 1. Maintaining bank account balances
- 2. Continuing to grow our income through grants and effective fundraising programs
- 3. Providing member benefits through expenditure in grants for travel and education including SLSQ camps.

Due to the enthusiastic hard work of our members we raised a total of \$142,053.00 (2018: \$120,870) in fundraising for the year. Key fundraising activities were: Ladies High Tea, Townsville V8's, Ewan Races and Sportsman Lunch

We appreciate the continued support provided by our sponsors and their contribution have made a significant difference this year.

Once again, the island club house provides us with a steady income that is increasing every year and after the clubhouse refurbishment we hope to see its utilisation increase.

Expenditure

Expenses have increased to \$373,739 (2018: \$335,839) from the prior year mainly due to advertising and marketing (new merchandising), insurance and fund-raising expenses. Once again, we had more income but also more related expenditure.

Compliance

All tax and superannuation obligations have been met. ACNC guidelines have been applied and maintained to meet set governance standards.


